

Meanwhile, as the mainland of Maracoor suffers an assault by a foreign navy, the island's civil-servant overseer struggles to understand how an alien arriving on the shores of Maracoor Spot could threaten the stability and well-being of an entire nation. Is it myth or magic at work, for good or for ill?

The Another Day trilogy will follow this green-skinned girl from the island outpost into the unmapped badlands of Maracoor before she learns how, and becomes ready, to turn her broom homeward, back to her family and her lover, and back to the lands of Oz, which—in its beauty, suffering, mystery, injustice, and possibility—mirrors and reminds us all too clearly of the troubled yet sacred terrain of our own lives.
